

Dear Mr. Margetta,

We are answering your request for the geneological research of your ancestors in the family of Andrej Margitta:

In the Roman Catholic Register of the parish of Presov, we found the birth registration of Andrej Margitta who was born on December 14, 1888. His parents were Juraj Margita and Alzbeta Jaskanics. They were married on January 15, 1882—and we enclose their marriage certificate.

Andrej had six brothers and sisters: Anna, Verona (+), Jan, Imrich, Julius (+), Verona. Their birth dates are enclosed on a geneological list. The first-born sister Anna (1881) was born before the marriage of her parents and she is registered in the church registry as an illegitimate child. However, she was later confirmed as legitimate by the church office in Kosice due to the marriage of her parents.

The mother Alzbeta Jaskanics was born in Stropkov (as included in the footnote of her marriage) on December 14, 1857. Her parents were Andrej Jaskanics and Zuzana Mura—at the time of Albeta's marriage both her parents were deceased.

The father Juraj (Gyorgy) Margita was born in Presov on January 15, 1857 as the illegitimate child of his mother Barbara Margita who was at that time in prison. At the time of the marriage to Alzbeta Jaskanics, the name of the father was already omitted.

In his birth certificate (which we enclose) is written that his mother was from the village of Chminianska Nova Ves (Szinye Ujfalú). In the parish register of the Roman Catholic parish in Svinia (where the village of Chminianska was affiliated), we didn't find any report of the births of the brothers and sisters of Juraj Margita.

However, in the marriage register of that village, we found the registration of Juraj's mother's marriage and her name is Barbara Margita; she was married to the widower Jan Adamuf when she was 38 years old. Their marriage certificate dated May 15, 1867 is enclosed. This couple had no children. Even though we researched through the baptismal register of the Roman Catholic parish of Svinia and of Krizovany (where the village of Ondrasovce from which Jan Adamuf was) we found nothing.

On the census form of 1867, which copy we are sending to you, it is clear that that was the time that Babara Margita lived with her husband in the village of Ondrasovce. Under the numbers 2 and 3 are registered the children Andrej and Sidonia who came from the first marriage of Jan Adamuf and his first wife Anna Stofkov. Anna Stofkov died on March 8, 1867 when she was 50 years old. Two months after her death, Jan Adamuf married Barbara. According to her age registered during her marriage, we found the registration of her birth date in the birth register of the Roman Catholic parish of Svinia. Barbara was born March 10, 1828 in Chminianskej Novej Vsi. Her parents were Jan Margita and Anna Onderko. Her birth certificate is enclosed.

We consider this geneological research completed.
